Speeding down with the first toboggan at Lake Placid at the opening of the Olympic Winter Games; marching into class to learn the whys and wherefores of men and women's voices, and a peek into the disarmament conference at Geneva, Switzerland, are tempting bits of a real radio day.

A traditional ceremony of the Olympic Games is to be held at 7 a.m. (KFI) when all the athletes participating will stand in the center of the Olympic Stadium at Lake Placid. There they will take the oath promising to contend with sincerity and fairness in the games. This is a prelude to subsequent broadcasts to be released during the days of competition.
