The life story of Herodotus in historical dramatization, fifteen minutes with the Barnard Glee Club, a chat with William Hard at the Geneva conference and thirty minutes devoted to listening to Robert J. Bulkley, United States Senator of Ohio, on "Democratic Relief Plans." are tempting bits of radio today.

School children from 1 to 10 years of age will hear the life story of Herodotus, ancient historian, when they come to class in the American School of the Air (KHJ at 11:30.) The drama will reveal how Herodotus traveled all over the then-known world, making shrewd geographical and anthropological observations that added to the scientific value of his "Histories" and earned him the title of "Father of History."

In the second of a series of seven concerts given by the choirs and glee clubs of the leading women's colleges of the country, KHJ at 12:45 noon points to the Barnard Glee Club. The opening group of selections will be composed of "Touro-Louro-Louro" and "Les Anges Dans Nos Campagnes." The program will close with the presentation of three English madrigals, to include Thomas Morley's "I Go Before My Charmer." "Siabat Mater" will also be featured.

A leaf from the living history being made at Geneva is at your dial (KFI) at 3:30 this afternoon. William Hard, N.B.C.'s political analyst, will present his report of the disarmament conference proceedings. While touching back on our own home shores, Senator Bulkley (KECA) at 7 p.m. wrestles with the Democratic solution to the present economic crisis.
