"From ships to sealing wax" might be applied to the variety to be offered by radio today. Skating at Lake Placid, prize fighting in Los Angeles and dancing at the Mardi gras in New Orleans are among the features. To top it all, KHJ swings into the airy armada with a new series of musical dramatizations, "The Olympiads."

Both KFI and KHJ bid for the dial with visits to Lake Placid for the Olympic Winter Games. The first broadcast is to be offered over KFI at 6:45 o'clock this morning. The second will reach KHJ at noon when Ted Huslug puts on his car muffs and follows the world's fastest women skaters around the Olympic Stadium skating course.

The first Mardi gras carnival was held in New Orleans 100 years ago. Tonight at 7 KFI will whisk its listeners-in to the Royal Court, where the king and queen of the carnival are to be introduced by Walter Winchell. A bit of old New Orleans also is scheduled in the music of Irving Aaronson and His Commanders.

Re-creating the heroes and the heroic exploits of the Olympic Games since their beginning, KHJ at 8:45 is to launch "The Olympiads" over the entire Don Lee-Columbia network. Tonight's presentation will deal with the story of Hercules and the founding of the games, told in dialogue and music. Thrills, pathos, drama and humor are promised in what KHJ terms "one of the most educational and intensely interesting series of broadcasts ever released."

THE TIMES FORUM

Two unusual features are on The Times Forum program for this afternoon over KHJ. The first is Gypsy Smith, the celebrated evangelist, who is conducting a revival here. He will bring a nonsectarian message to the public at large. The other is Ed W. Hopkins, County Assessor, who will tell taxpayers how to make out their assessment blanks. He will explain some of the intricacies of tax assessing, and how values are fixed, and will enter into some detail with regard to what may be done to reduce taxes.
