Radio presents an exceptional array today, embracing a range of Class A releases from a dramatization of the death of Archimedes to a major international broadcast entitled "Hello, Europe."

By far the most ambitious program is to be heard over KHJ at 1 o'clock this afternoon. "Hello Europe" will originate at Nashville, Tenn. Eleven countries, including five which have not participated previously in broadcasts between the United States and Europe, will hear a program of spirituals by the A Cappella Chorus and Jubilee Singers of Fisk University. The presentation is to be heard simultaneously in the United States and Canada.

Newcomers to the international hook-up which will be linked in for this broadcast are Holland, Switzerland, Denmark, Norway and Sweden, so that it actually will be broadcast in countries with a population totaling 316,000,000. DX fans throughout the world will be able to pick it up from Columbia's two short wave stations, W2XE in New York and W3XAU, Philadelphia.

The return of "Rajput" (KNX at 7:15) will intrigue those who like oriental mystery. Hair-raising thrills, spies, murder and torture will feature the offering. The time scheduled on KNX is 7:15 p.m. each Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

With Alex Gray, Lawrence Tibbett, a play entitled "Poker vs. Bridge" and KHJ's Blue Monday Jamboreadors edging up for a hand, there should be ample entertainment to meet all preferences. Tonight's Jamboree program has been prepared in accord with public demand.

NAME CHANGE PROTESTED
