"There's music in the air" is well exemplified on today's radio, with three releases standing a bit above all else.

First, at 11 a.m. over KHJ, Vladimir Shavitch will conduct a varied and representative program of classical and modern works in a full-length concert by the Syracuse Symphony Orchestra, from Syracuse, N. Y. The Syracuse orchestra was founded in 1920 and, under Shavitch's guidance, has attained a position among the foremost symphonic organizations in the country. The program will open with the Military Symphony of Haydn. The repertoire to be heard is as follows:

Second in the day's outstanding features is Verdi's "La Traviata," to be heard over KECA at 12:30 p.m. The third and fourth acts of this opera as presented in the Metropolitan Operahouse, New York, with Lucrezia Bori, soprano, singing the role of Violetta, and Frederick Jagel, tenor, that of Alfred, are to be offered at this time. Deems Taylor, noted composer and music critic, seated in a box in the operahouse, will make comments between acts and during the performance.

San Gabriel's beloved "Mission Play" greets the Southland with a bevy of its stars over KHJ at 6:30 p.m. Actors, soloists and instrumentalists of John Steven McGroarty's masterpiece are to be heard. R. D. MacLean, eminent Shakespearean actor, for nine years leading man for the Mission Play, will deliver the Shylock scene from "The Merchant of Venice." There will be songs by Miss Evelyn Snow, leading woman; Thad Harvey, tenor, and Miss Madline Lux, prima donna.

THE TIMES FORUM

Mrs. G. U. Purdy, whose contract bridge talks have been a popular feature of The Times Forum, will deliver another today, going on the air over KHJ at 1:30 o'clock. And beginning next Saturday Mrs. Purdy will inaugurate a series of half-hour lessons, taking up the playing of a complete hand each Saturday and explaining the way the hand should be played. Also on the Forum today will be Arthur Millier, Times art critic, who will talk on the romantic life of J. J. Audubon, the famous painter of birds, outlining also his work and his California experience.
