Hoover to Be Heard in Talk to Senate and House

 Great Britain, France and Czecho-Slovakia sweep over the Atlantic with words and music to honor George Washington: from the national Capitol at Washington, D. C., Alexandria, Va., Boston, Mass., Lake Union, Seattle, in fact from the four corners of the earth radio raises its voice and music in celebrant the bicentennial of George Washington's Birthday.

Dominating and launching this tumultuous cascade of honor to the first President is, of course, the George Washington celebration from the Capitol of the United States, during which President Hoover and Honorable James M. Beck of Pennsylvania will speak (FKI and KHJ). At this time President Hoover will be heard addressing a joint session of the House and Senate from the floor of the House of Representatives. John Philip Sousa, Walter Damrosch, the Army, Navy and Marine Corp bands will outdo themselves today to make the air waves throb with patriotism.

Of the international broadcasts, the most significant perhaps is to be heard over KECA at 2 p.m. when France pours onto the air her tribute to Washington. It is expected that either President Doumer or Premier Tardieu will speak for France and Ambassador Edge for the United States.

Listeners-in will discover an argosy of pleasure in today's radio high lights and the dial, and last but not least is Los Angeles' own tribute to this day (KMTR and KMPO at 11 a.m.) A pageant of music, song and noted speakers.

THE TIMES FORUM
 The Times Forum period over KHJ at 1:30 p.m. today will be devoted to commemorating the 200th birthday anniversary of George Washington. The principal orator will be made by Orra Eugene Monnette, president of the Library Board, who will talk on "Restoration of Faith in Government," basing his arguments on Washington's life as soldier and President. In addition, there will be two short talks of school pupils, one from Adele Zink of Los Angeles High School, and one from William M. Jenkins, Jr., of Pasadena High School. Both will give their own estimates of Washington as the one who has gleaned them from the educational courses in history and oratory.
