Music, both concert and popular,  
leads in the wealth of radio enter-  
tainment today. Beginning with a  
Columbia salute to the memory of  
Mozart, delineating in this mas-  
ter's compositions his life from  
youth to manhood, the broadcast  
array will include the Los Angeles  
Philharmonic Symphony Orches-  
tra, a surprise special from KFRC,  
San Francisco, and a new series  
entitled "Today and Yesterday."

KHJ at 11:30 o'clock this morn-  
ing offers a Columbia feature, the  
American School of the Air, with  
a program woven about the life of  
Mozart and designed especially for  
pupils of the intermediate grades.  
Ranging from a minuet which Mo-  
zart wrote when only 4 years of  
age, followed by a gavotte which  
he composed at 6. The presenta-  
tion will paint in music each step  
of the career of this genius.

Again over KHJ at 9 o'clock to-  
night, a number of athletic stars  
are to be guests in KFRC's surprise  
special. Among those to be pre-  
sented are Frank Wykoff, Lee  
Barnes and Georgia Coleman. It  
is "Olympic Night," with Gov.  
Rolph dedicating the half-hour.

### "THE TIMES" FORUM

What promises to be an outstand-  
ing discussion of the Sino-Japa-  
nese controversy is scheduled for  
The Times Forum period over KHJ  
at 1:30 o'clock this afternoon. Rep-  
resentatives of both countries will  
lay before listeners-in their ideas  
of the situation. The Chinese view-  
point will be presented by Dr.  
Samuel Pfang, head of the Chi-  
nese Defense League of Los An-  
geles, a student of Chinese govern-  
mental and military affairs. The  
Japanese angle will be handled by  
Masao Dodo, editor of Los Angeles  
Japanese Daily News (Rafu Shim-  
po.) who is said to be exceedingly  
well informed on the Nipponese  
stand. Each is to talk for about  
ten minutes and will be presented  
by Fred Hogue, of The Times edi-  
torial staff. Mr. Hogue has made  
several trips to the Orient and is  
especially well informed on mat-  
ters there, as his series of Forum  
talks on "Problems of the Pacific"  
have testified. This presentation  
will be broadcast over the Pacific  
network of KHJ as well as locally.
