First on the broadcast feature list  
today is the American School of the  
Air (KHJ at 11:30 a.m.) with the  
story of Charlemagne, who brought  
order out of chaos in Western Eu-  
rope, founded France and Germany  
and was crowned Emperor of the  
West by the Pope with his court  
at Aachen. This dramatization will  
be attended by Columbia's pupils  
throughout the nation.

Another national release that  
holds much promise is on the sched-  
ule of KECA for 1:15 o'clock this af-  
ternoon, a new series direct from the  
round table of the national confer-  
ence of Jews and Christians now be-  
ing held at Washington. Newton D.  
Baker and leaders of the Protestant,  
Catholic and Jewish faiths will be  
heard in pleas for religious toler-  
ance and understanding. The aim of  
the conference is to promote national  
consideration of the best  
means of analyzing and allaying  
prejudices among various religious  
groups.

"Sing Sing" or "The School of  
Hard Knocks" is the thespian atroc-  
ity to be offered by the Deep Dram-  
atic Company as a feature of the  
"Blue Monday Jamboree" (KHJ at  
8.) Designated as "Plumbers' Night,"  
it will be dedicated to the gentle-  
men who sink to sleep beneath a  
sink, and who do not use a needle  
to thread a pipe. Everything from  
dam leaks to the garden hose will  
be mended with fun.

The Times Forum at 1:30 this  
afternoon over KHJ is to be de-  
voted to sports. W. M. (Bill) Henry,
