After sweeping the shamrocks from the air, today's radio starts off with the Grand National Races in England. Other features include an excellent half-hour with the United States Marine Band, baseball, prize fighting and concerts.

While there may be few except the horses up at 6:45 o'clock this morning, KECA is to release a word picture of the ninety-fourth running of England's Grand National, the world's most historic and hazardous steeplechase. This is run on the course at Aintree, near Liverpool.

Before the United States Marine Band concert over KHJ at noon there will be a session of the American School of the Air, offered by the same station at 11:30. "Education," as a theme of the Vocational Guidance Course, is to be the topic of William John Cooper, United States Commissioner of Education.

In the group of concerts and varieties during the evening, for excellency of music, KHJ with its "Vignettes" at 9:15 bids high. This series, under the baton of Raymond Paige, traces with music of a master's pen the life of the master himself.

Thomas Casey, Forgery Convict, Dies in Prison

SACRAMENTO, March 17. (Exclusive)—Death in Folsom prison has ended the criminal career of Thomas M. Casey, 73 years of age, banker and head of the Casey Investment Company of Huntington Park. Casey was sentenced to four years in a Missouri prison when a bank in Clinton, Mo., failed in 1905. He was charged with forgery and said he committed the crime to try to save the bank.

Later Casey came to California and organized the investment company at Huntington Park. Once again he ran afoul of the law by selling \$150,000 worth of forged deeds, mortgages and notes. He pleaded guilty in December, 1930, to forgery, explaining he committed the crime to get money to pay persons who lost their savings in the Missouri bank failure.

Treatment for Anemia Hailed

CINCINNATI, March 17. (P)—Discovery of a new treatment for pernicious anemia, a common disease, was credited today to the Cincinnati General Hospital staff by Dr. A. C. Bachmeyer, superintendent. Bachmeyer said the new treatment "now is beyond the experimental stage and the startling results obtained soon will be released to the medical profession and eventually to the public."
