### TOBACCO MARKET OPEN

**MELBOURNE (Australia) April 16.**  
 (Exclusive)—At least 15,000,000  
 pounds of locally produced tobacco  
 leaf could be used on the Aus-  
 tralian market, according to the  
 Federal minister in charge of de-  
 velopment. The preliminary esti-  
 mate of tobacco production in Aus-  
 tralia for the current year is be-  
 tween 8,000,000 and 9,000,000 pounds.
