

TELEVISION AVAILABLE TO LOS ANGELES PUBLIC

Dr. D. M. Morandini Announces He Has Devised Receiving Set to Show Pictures From KHJ

Blasting the popular belief that television is in an embryonic stage, Dr. D. M. Morandini, engineer, and professor of physics, comes forward with the assertion that he has devised a television "receiver" set combined with radio which will enable Angelenos to enjoy televised pictures from the Don Lee station, or from his own studio.

"You may think television is still in dreamland," Dr. Morandini declared, "but the fact is we send and receive pictures hurled through space day after day in Los Angeles. One may look in every night and see clear images.

"SEEING AND HEARING"

"At the present time we are developing a transmitter-receiver television machine, by means of which two persons will be able to converse and see each other at the same time. This is done by my new cathode-tube which was described in engineering periodicals recently."

He said that he is confident that such a device will be available to the public within a few months. If the doctor is right, regular visual programs by artists with accompanying sound and musical effects are within arm's reach.

"Television should not be held in abeyance for so-called business reasons," Dr. Morandini declared. "Its development has been so rapid during the past year, and the interest in it is so great, I see no reason why we should not make Los Angeles the first American city to make practical use of this inventive research."

SCHEDULE AUGMENTED

So popular were the Don Lee television broadcasts during the recent Radio Show in Los Angeles that both transmitters of the system have been placed on a new and augmented schedule, at the insistence of request of experimenters.

Both W6XS and W6AO are now operated from 7 to 9 p.m. nightly, and on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9 to 11 a.m., transmitting images of eighty lines at fifteen frames a second.

"Lookers" from as far away as Santa Paula have identified scenes as broadcast through the Don Lee television stations by means of motion-picture film.

Maj. Gladstone Murray, an executive of the British Broadcasting Company, will be presented at 2 p.m. over KHJ, when he speaks on "Radio Decisive for World Citizenship." Maj. Murray is en route to England from Canada, where he has completed organization of the new Canadian Radio System.

In frank discussions of the problems confronting the nation, Col. Louis McHenry Howe, secretary to President Roosevelt, will inaugurate a series of weekly broadcasts over the N.B.C. network. On each occasion he will be interviewed by Walter Trumbull, newspaper correspondent, giving his views of the developments in Congress during the week. (KFI—6 p.m.)

One of Gotham's scintillating stage stars, June Walker, is the star of today's "Pages of Romance" presentations. She will assume the leading role in "The Name is Lois," a dramatization of a short story by Francis Thayer.
