Make Yourself a Job WITH ED BISHOP The Idea Hunter

Following up a recent idea from an Iowa postmaster about painting and repairing rural mail boxes, Assistant Postmaster J. W. Jeffries, Jr., of Peoria suggests that a lucrative business can be created from the idea of eliminating mail boxes on residences. He points out that postal authorities encounter frequent reports of loss of mail because mail boxes are not locked and delivered mail often is removed by mischievous children and irresponsible transients. The Postoffice Department, he says, advocates a slot in the front door instead of a box and would welcome the efforts of anyone offering to install these slots as a house-to-house business. It is especially advantageous to the occupants in bad weather, or when the house is unoccupied for several days or weeks.
