SPAGHETTI AU BACON.

1 package spaghetti

4 slices bacon diced

1 onion (1 clove of garlic)

1 can tomato soup

1 can water

Grated cheese to suit

Cook and drain spaghetti as usual nine minutes, put diced bacon and cut up onion (and garlic) in a frying pan. Cook to golden brown, then add to the onion and bacon in the frying pan the can of tomato soup and can of water, also 1 green pepper cut up. Bring to a good boil. Put layer of spaghetti in casserole, pour over some of the sauce, then some grated cheese. Repeat until casserole is filled. Bake for one-half hour.
