A new sister act is scheduled for the air tomorrow afternoon. The Dionne Sisters, of Callender, Ontario, will appear before the microphones under the auspices of the Canadian Radio Commission and the personal direction of Dr. Allan Roy DaFoe. But no one is willing as yet to guarantee that the girls will go into their act.

It seems their vocabulary is very, very scant indeed for big-time radio and their humors are as changeable as the seasons. But it is hoped that the half-hour will be successful, whatever the turn it takes.

The occasion of the quints being presented on the air is the celebration of their second birthday party.

According to announcement of the United Press, any radio station in the United States may present the program free of charge. Thus far neither the National Broadcasting Co. or the Columbia Broadcasting System has advised whether their networks will make the pick-up.

Unfortunately the program could not be heard in Washington direct from Canadian stations. It will be necessary for one of the American networks to make wire connections with the Canadian network carrying the event, and thus feed the broadcast to stations in this part of the country, for Washington listeners to hear it.

If anything definite transpires, it will be reported in this space tomorrow morning. The time has been set by the Canadian commission as 5:30, Washington time.

When an individual star is developed through the channels of radio announcing, that is news. And that is what has happened in the case of Don Wilson, announcer on the Jack Benny programs. Beginning June 28, when Benny and Mary Livingstone leave the series for the summer, Wilson will be starred in his own right. He will be assisted by "other elements" to form a complete show but final decisions on these artists has not been reached.

Wilson's entry into the ranks of individual stars tops a career beginning with salesmanship, following graduation from the University of Colorado, through membership in a vocal trio on the air in Denver and sports announcing. His drafting as a member of the Benny cast marked him as an outstanding radio performer for Benny makes "actors" out of every one associated with his air show.

Whatever the type of show produced to star Wilson, it will present him in a master-of-ceremonies role.
