1:15 P. M., WMAL—Mr. and Mrs. Henry C. Spielman, their son, John, 17, and daughter Mary, 16, have been chosen as a typical Washington family and as such they will live in one of the model F. H. A. houses at the New York's World Fair. An interview with this local family at their home-for-a-week begins the first in a series on a typical American family.
