

The Post Radio Highlights

FREQUENCY CHANGES GO INTO EFFECT THIS MORNING.
Four of the five local radio stations are affected, with WMAL remaining the same at 630 on the dial. WRC is heard at 980, WOL at 1260, WINX at 1340 and WJSV at 1500. Dial-twisters thus find those stations a few notches higher on their dials. Push-button owners may tune in via their tuning buttons until their sets are readjusted.
