SECRETARY OF STATE
George C. Marshall's address before the Council of Foreign Relations in Chicago will be broadcast at 10:30 tonight over WTOP-CBS and at 11:30 (recorded) over WOL.

Eugene Meyer, chairman of the board of The Washington Post, and Al Friendly, reporter for The Washington Post, will be guest speakers at the Advertising Club luncheon today. Recently returned from Europe, they will discuss economic conditions abroad in their talks, which will be broadcast at 1:05 p. m. over WINX, WINX-FM and WASH-FM.

"The Future of Germany" will be discussed tonight at 8:30 over WMAL-ABC in a special two-way broadcast between Berlin

and New York. Karl Specker, chairman of the bizonal organization in Frankfurt; Maj. Gen. George P. Hays, Deputy Military Governor of Germany, and members of a German audience will speak from Europe. James P. Warburg, financier and author of "Germany, Bridge or Battleground;" Sonia Tomara, New York Herald Tribune correspondent, and an American audience will participate from here. Armed Forces Radio Services will carry the broadcast overseas.
