A five-part dramatic series, "Lost Sheep," based on actual case histories of juvenile delinquents will begin tonight at 11:30

p. m. over WRC. The weekly series is being auditioned for possible network use, and was prepared by George Wheeler of WRC and Dr. Benjamin Karpman, head psychiatrist at St. Elizabeths, who will appear in the drama tonight.
