TODAY'S RADIO HIGHLIGHTS

Top news stories of the year will be recalled, some in dramatic form, tonight at 10 over WMAL. Walter Winchell, Drew Pearson, Louella Parsons, Martin Agronsky, Elmer Davis, Harry Wismer and Bill Corum are among the ABC commentators participating in the hour-long broadcast.

Ever since CBS started a pseudo-historical series called "CBS Is There," the phrase has been shouted with glee by the office wits whenever the network proved particularly on the ball about anything.

Well, CBS is there tonight. Hans Van Meegeren, Dutch painter who fooled experts with his imitations of the old masters, died Tuesday night in Amsterdam. And it just happens that WTOP-CBS has a dramatization of his life scheduled for tonight at 10.

The program, starring Paul Muni, has been planned for some time to be sure. But now, with a few minor changes in the script, CBS will be there!

The annual bowl games are all set for broadcasting: the Orange Bowl game at 1:45 over WTOP,

the Gator Bowl game at 1:45 over WINX and WINX-FM, the Cotton Bowl game at 2 over WOL, the Sugar Bowl game at 2:30 over WMAL and the Rose Bowl game at 4:45 over WRC.

The East-West game from San Francisco will be carried by WOL and WASH-FM at 4:45.
