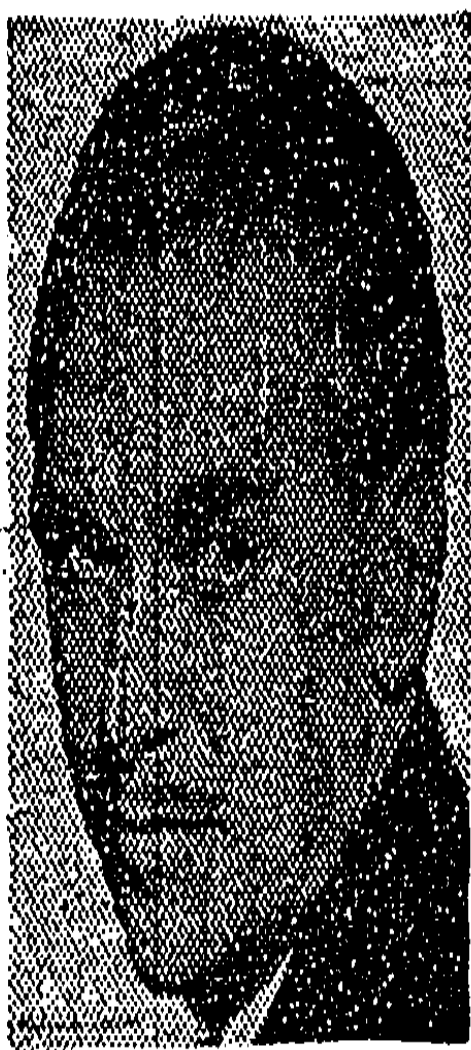


Sunday Radio Highlights
