

# Saturday's Radio Program

WTOP BEGINS a series of broadcasts about the work of the State Department's "Voice of America" broadcasts to other countries, at 6:15 p. m. today. The first of the series tells "Why the Voice Speaks."

WRC ALSO begins a documentary series today at 7:30 p. m. This series, featuring Fredric March as narrator, will be devoted to America's children and will take up in four broadcasts the problems of day care, adoptions, foster homes and mental hygiene.

WRC—6:30. "A Laurentian Overture" by Alan Shulman (dedicated to Tallulah Bankhead) is played by the NBC Symphony.

WTOP—9. The Willie Sutton story, Part 2, is presented on "Gangbusters."
