The opera is sung by soprano Elizabeth Schwarzkopf as Eva, baritone Otto Edelmann as Hans Sachs and tenor Hans Hopf as Walter Stolzing. The accompanying cast of singers, chorus and the Bayreuth Festival Orchestra are under the baton of Herbert von Karajan.
