WTOP HAS A BUSY day today with Jack Benny, "The Quiz Kids," "The Symphonette" and "The Choraliers" returning to the air. Benny, highest-rated radio star for the past 20 years, returns at 7 p. m. with most of his old cast. Bob Crosby replaces Phil Harris in the bandleader role, however.

"The Quiz Kids" go into their twelfth season (4 p. m.), with a group of small fry from last year's show, but by no means the original batch, which has long since grown up.

"The Symphonette" (2 p. m.) and "The Choraliers" (10:05 p. m.) each begin a fifth season today. Mishel Piastro leads the Symphonette in single movements of long classical works. Eugene Lowell uses familiar ballads and popular songs for his all-male chorus.

ON WRC at 8:30 p. m. "The Theater Guild on the Air" will ring up the curtain on its 1952-53 season with Helen Hayes and Joseph Cotten in "The Wisteria Tree."

Joshua Logan's drama will have Miss Hayes in her original stage triumph as the sensitive member of a charming and carefree family which refuses to recognize its financial predicament.
