THE NATIONAL RADIO PREMIERE of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony as recorded for the first time by Toscanini will take place today on the Paul Hume show on WGMS at 3 p.m. One New York station will also play the recording today. The record will not be generally available until October 1. Jan Peerce, Eileen Farrell, Norman Scott, Nan Merriman, the Robert Shaw Chorale and the NBC Symphony are the performers. Hume will comment on the new recording.

"AMOS 'N' ANDY" will begin their twenty-fifth year on the air at 7:30 tonight on WTOP. Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll, creators of the pair, are still playing the roles.
