

# Sunday Radio Highlights and Radio Program Logs

AN ALL-NETWORK APPEAL for blood will be broadcast today with Arthur Godfrey, Dinah Shore, Ezio Pinza, Marguerite Piazza and Sam Levenson among the stars participating. The half-hour broadcast will be carried at 3 p. m. on WRC and WTOP. By transcription it will also be carried at 8 p. m. on WMAL and at 9 p. m. on WWDC.

The program, called "Roll Up Your Sleeves," is a joint project of the Federal Civil Defense Administration, the American Red Cross and the Department of Defense.

"MUSIC IN THE WHITE HOUSE" will be theme of the Paul Hume broadcast today at 3 p. m. on WGMS. In addition to playing recordings not in general circulation which are related to present or past incumbents of the White House, Hume will answer such questions as:

- "What President played the slide trombone?"
- "What President wrote a song with which he courted the lady who married him?"
- "What President was said to be the worst violinist in Virginia?"
