VETERAN NEWSMAN EARL GODWIN will be heard throughout the world describing the many presidential inaugurations he's seen and reported over the years. He was interviewed by the "Voice of America" and his comments will be heard throughout Europe and Asia.

Godwin recalled the first Inauguration he attended was for Grover Cleveland. This was before he took up the reportorial trade. In 1909, however, he was with the working press at the Inauguration of President William Howard Taft. And he's covered everyone else who's been inaugurated since then.

In 1912 he was director of publicity for Woodrow Wilson. "I was also the publicity man for FDR during one of his campaigns," Earl said, "but there were so many, I can't remember which one."

Godwin will again take a major part in reporting President-elect Eisenhower's Inauguration for NBC Tuesday.
