

Wednesday TV Preview

(Today's Best Bets as previewed by TV Key's staff of experts.)

7:30 p. m.—WMAL-TV. Disneyland: "The Story of Donald Duck." The notable life saga of the belligerent duck. You'll see "Orphans Benefit," Donald's first public appearance and "Donald's Dream Voice," the quaint tale of Donald's experiment in changing his voice. In addition, tonight's show is crowded with segments from Donald's countless other cartoon adventures. You'll see him contending with crocodiles, panthers, bees, sharks, ants and other forms of wild life. You'll see him a variety of characterizations, including the inevitable takeoff on Dagnet's Jack Webb. There's some animated by-play between Donald and Walt Disney, and the story of Donald ends as it should, with a cartoon. One minor criticism, Disney spends almost as much time telling the story as Donald does acting it. Of the two, Donald is by far the most entertaining. Recommended for the entire family.

8 p. m.—WRC-TV. "I Married Joan": A shaggy dog

story. Joan wants a chihuahua, Brad says no, so she brings home a St. Bernard behind his back. When he relents and brings home a St. Bernard behind her back, the fur really flies. We're not sure how funny the show is, but we're crazy about dogs.

9 p. m.—WRC-TV. Kraft Theater: "The Independent." Two former journalists, also former sweethearts, are running for political office, and the path of true love is strewn with fights and reprisals. This is a pleasant, sometimes amusing romantic comedy, with a good cast headed by Jeffrey Lynn and Francis Robinson.

10:30 p. m.—WRC-TV. Big Town: "Rat Pack." A grim and important subject, not new, but worth retelling often. The story of a ruthless gang of adolescent boys who terrorize a neighborhood with vicious attacks on innocent people. Some thrilling moments. Even though the show does little more than hint at a solution to what is becoming a major American problem, it never hurts to be kept aware of it.
