# Gale Page Rises to New Heights

One of the newer stars of the networks, yet one who has been firmly established as a headliner of the first rank, is stunning Gale Page, featured blues singer on the air waves.

She was born in Spokane, Wash., in 1910 and spent her youth on the coast. Neither of her parents had leanings toward public entertainment, but an older sister preceded Gale into the public eye, singing in Broadway musical shows. Her education was received in a private school in California where she studied voice and piano, giving her a groundwork for the career into which she went later.

Her debut in radio came when she was only 20. She sang over a Spokane station for a short time, proved such a success that she was called to Chicago to fill a spot on the sustaining program of one of the national network stations, and soon was signed to a commercial. That was in October of 1932 and since then she has steadily advanced in popularity until today she rates as one of the most promising of newer stars of the broadcasting world.

Her favorite amusements are dancing and backgammon and her pet diversions in the way of sports are swimming and tennis. She says laziness is her worst fault but has proved such an ambitious youngster that her climb in radio has been little short of meteoric.

Since her career demands so much of her time, she has little chance for romance, but usually prefers blondes of the opposite sex, is five feet five inches tall and is a striking brunet.
