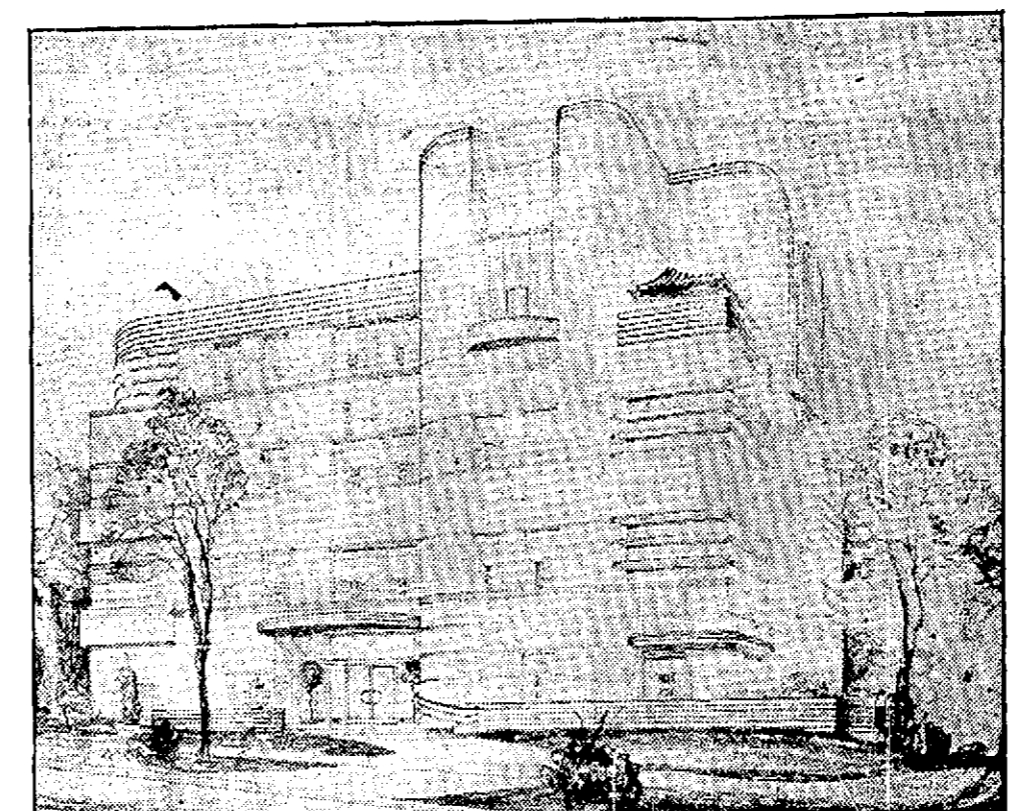

Modern Apartment Building Started



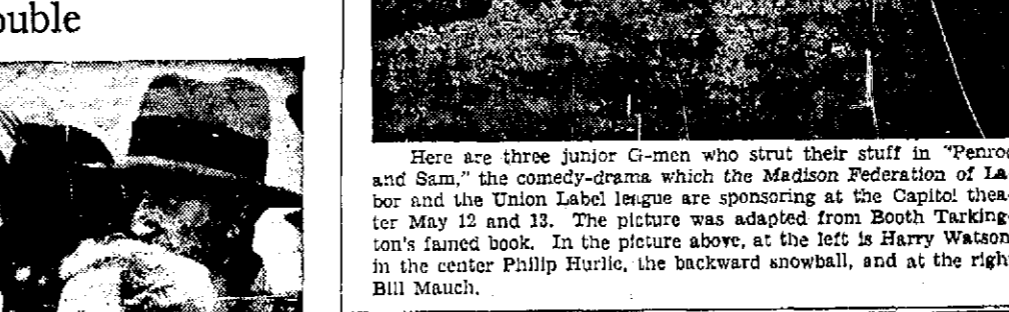
Work has been started on the largest apartment building planned in Madison since the advent of the depression. An architect's drawing of the \$125,000 building is shown above. It was designed by Lawrence

Monberg, Chicago architect, for the owners and builders, Drs. Sverre, A. A., G. D., and Rolt A. Quisling of Madison. The address of the new structure is 1 E. Gilman st., at the Wisconsin ave. intersection, on the site of the old W. D. Hestland property.

It will be a fireproof building, constructed of smooth-faced brick and trimmed in terra cotta. Provision has been made for 26 apartments, ranging in size from one room to five and including three penthouse units of five rooms each, flanked by room gardens. Most of the apartments will be furnished, and modernistic furniture will be used throughout. Year around air conditioning will be supplied.

J. H. Findorff and Sons, Madison, have the general contract, and the landscaping contract has been awarded to the McKay nurseries. It is expected that the building will be ready for occupancy by Sept. 1.
