

# Radio: Black to Answer Charges Over Three Networks



Justice Hugo L. Black will answer charges that he is a member of the Klu Klux Klan over the combined networks of the nation's broadcast chains tonight at 8:30. He will speak for 20 minutes over the NBC, CBS, and Mutual networks. Justice Black will be heard in this area over WBA, WBBM, WGN, WMAQ, WENR, and WTMJ.

**City Debt in Error 45 Years**
