The Greatest Ball Game Ever Played on This Date

This is another of a series of articles, which will be printed each day reviewing the greatest baseball game ever played on this date.

October 17, 1911, at New York
Jack Coombs and Christy Mathewson battled 11 innings before the Athletics won the third game of the world series from the Giants, 3-2.

Mathewson held Philadelphia in check until the ninth when Baker drove a home run into the right field stand to tie the score.

Conlie Mack's Athletics tallied twice in the eleventh; Eddie Collins singled after Oldring had been put out, and when Buck Herzog threw wide to first on Baker's bounder...

Herzog started the Giants final bid with a double; Fletcher fled to Lord; Herzog took third on Meyers' out, Collins to Davis, and scored when Collins fumbled Beals Becker's hopper...

Jack Coombs gave McGraw's lads but three hits, and not one did he grant during the nine innings in which the Giants failed to score.

NOTE: On this date in 1910, "Chief" Bender won the first game of the world series for the Athletics over the Cubs, yielding but three hits.
