Notes to You

Let's Throw Some Adjectives in Ashcan
When advertising became a business or profession, and was recognized even by colleges and universities, professors and practitioners set up certain rules which were supposed to guarantee the effectiveness of their work. And the most strongly emphasized was this:
"Don't use negatives."
Which, of course, was a negative rule. It sounded a good deal like the one set up by an apocryphal professor of English: "A preposition is the wrong word to end a sentence with."
Every day it becomes more obvious that the boys in the advertising game have tossed that one in the ashcan. Witness such lines as "no bruch, no lather, no rub-in"; "no stoop, no squat, no squint"; "not an expensive place to eat"; and "no orchestral din."
The only purpose of this outburst is to suggest that theaters might, to their advantage, lean slightly in the direction of negative advertising. It wouldn't be necessary to say that the current film is NOT colossal, magnificent, stupendous, unprecedented, nor super-something-or-other. On the contrary, the ads need only omit such dime-a-dozen adjectives-on the grounds that when the theater has a picture which deserves them, people might believe them.
Too often they read the adjectives and hum a Gershwin tune-"It Ain't Necessarily So."
