Chequamegon Forest Road Gets Bulk of U. S. Cash

WASHINGTON-A total of \$71,287 is available for Wisconsin in federal appropriations for forest roads in the present fiscal year, and of that \$50,000 will be devoted to the Chequamegon National Forest, officials of the Forest Service here report.
Whether or not the state will take advantage of the remaining \$1,287 depends on approval by the forest service of whatever plans the state highway department may submit.
An additional \$37,283 is available in forest road development funds, according to officials. This amount is for expenditure on secondary roads and truck trails. Last year only \$34,336 was available for Wisconsin forest roads. The increase this year is due to the fact that the forest service has reduced the normal appropriation to Alaska.
