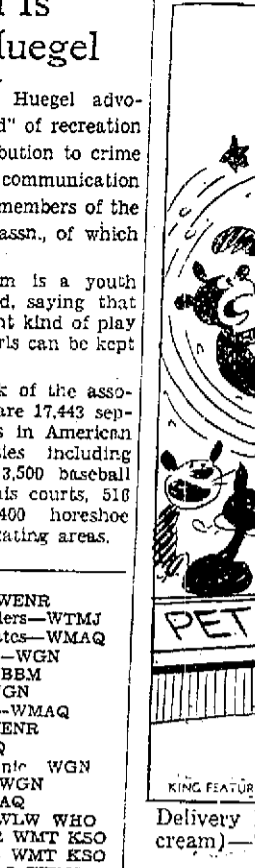

'Right Kind' of Recreation Is Asked by Huegel

Dr. Raymond W. Huegel advocated "the right kind" of recreation activities as a contribution to crime prevention in a communication Monday to Madison members of the National Recreation assn., of which he is sponsor here.
"Our crime problem is a youth problem," he declared, saying that by furnishing the right kind of play activities boys and girls can be kept "straight".
The 1937 Year Book of the association reports there are 17,443 separate recreation areas in American communities, including 1,400 athletic fields, 3,500 baseball diamonds, 10,000 tennis courts, 510 bathing beaches, 8,400 horseshoe courts and 2,400 ice skating areas.

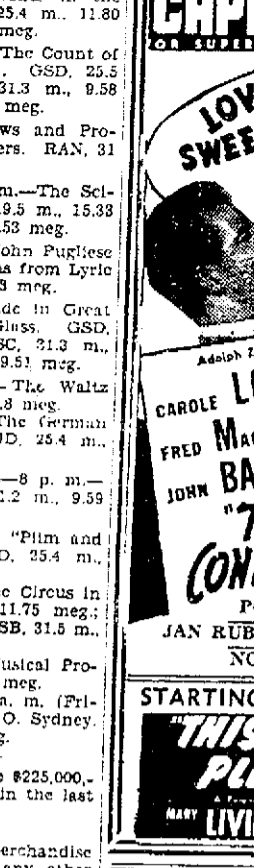
