Hanks to Attend Conference

Stanley C. Hanks, Madison real estate broker, will attend a conference of real estate executives and architects, called to consider preliminary plans for initiating the billion-dollar federal housing program, Jan. 27 and 28 in the Palmer house at Chicago.

Following President Roosevelt's

recommendation to congress that federal aid be instituted to facilitate investment of private capital in home construction, real estate men have divided the country into districts and have conducted housing surveys, the results of which will be reported at the conference.

Tentative plans call for the

inauguration of projects and expenditure of \$200,000,000 annually for five years in 100 key cities of the nation.
