


## Invoke Neutrality Act, Villard Asks Roosevelt

NEW YORK - (U.P.) - A fascist military dictatorship will develop in the United States "the minute this country goes into war," Oswald Garrison Villard, newspaper editor and former magazine publisher, said Sunday in an addres before the National Republican club of New York.

Villard praised the Roosevelt administration for its reciprocal trade programs as an instrument of peace but urged President Roosevelt to invoke the neutrality act in the far eastern crisis. He advocated a policy of strict neutrality in China, to be exemplified first by the withdrawal of American ships, interests, and nationals and second by application of the neutrality legislation passed in the last session of congress,

"The doctrine that the American flag must follow every dollar invested no matter where it is," said, "is, I hope, forever at an end. "I beg of you therefore, as devoted American citizens bent on preserving this republic, to join in keeping it out of war and insisting that no matter how many Amer-icans may be in a given war zone, or how great their investment, they shall not be allowed to jeopardize our beloved republic . . .


