Loomis Protests Application for N. D. Radio Permit

A protest against granting the Robert-McNab Co. a permit to construct a radio station with the same frequency and power as that allocated to state station WBLB, Stevens Point, was filed with the federal communications commission today by Atty. Gen. Orland S. Loomis. Loomis referred in his formal protest to WBLB's pending application before the commission for increased broadcasting time. Loomis appeared in Washington at the hearing Jan. 7 on the WBLB application. The attorney general pointed out that the Jameson application "might tend to hinder, prevent or

British Trains to Use Radio

LONDON-(AP)-Great Britain's railways, among the world's safest, are to be made still safer during 1938. "The Big Four"-London Midland and Scottish, London North Eastern, Great Western and Southern companies-are planning to spend millions in the installation and effective operation of new devices for signaling and train control. Included in the ambitious scheme are automatic train control, three-color light signals, illuminated track diagrams in signal boxes, power signaling, area control offices, and message-recording apparatus. Although still in the early stage of experiment, by far the most revolutionary move on the railways is radio communication between signalmen and engine-drivers. Secret tests have been carried out in a large yard, where wireless apparatus has been fixed on control points and on shunting engines. So far the Great Western is the only company operating the system of automatic train control, but the other three companies have almost completed their experiments. Under the G. W. R. system, by

means of ramps between the lines and a contact shoe on the engine. The driver is told the position of each caution signal, even if he cannot see it. If set at all clear, a bell rings in the engine cab. If at danger, a siren blows, and the brakes are automatically applied. The brakes remain on until the driver acknowledges the signal by lifting a small handle on the apparatus in his cab.
