The loss was the fourth straight for the defending league champions in 11 days.

Displaying uncanny accuracy from the field after their 33-10 loss to Whitewater College high last week, Coach Hamilton Blake's Brodhead cagers collected all but one of their points on field goals. Only 11 fouls were imposed on the two teams.

Lake Mills took an 8-3 lead in the first quarter and led at the intermission, 12-9. Rallying gamely, Brodhead gained a 15-11 tie in the third quarter. Bob Wolfe's basket forcing the deadlock in the last minute. While the visitors were held scoreless, Tom Kelly, Don Timm, and Duane Youngblood scored baskets to bring Brodhead victory in the last quarter.

Lone Rock Coasts to 19-14 Victory Over Lime Ridge

(Special to The Journal) LONE ROCK, Wis.—After piling up a comfortable 14-2 lead in the first two quarters, Coach C. A. Peacock's Lone Rock high school cagers coasted to their second half victory Tuesday night and scored a convincing 19-14 victory over Lime Ridge in a postponed game. The win left Lone Rock in second place in the Wisconsin River league standings, a half-game behind Blue River's undisputed leaders.

John Pollard, Don Marks, and Bill Martin were the chief scoring cogs in the home machine, but it was a great display of teamwork by the entire squad showed that really accounted for the triumph.

Pollard was the leading scorer with seven points on three goals and three free throws. Marks and Martin followed with five and four points, respectively. John Olson also played stellar ball in the winners' lineup, sparking on defense and acting as a "feeder" to his mates on offense. Hart and Hineman stood out in Lime Ridge's lineup as they sparked its fourth quarter rally of 10 points; they were tied for scoring honors on their team with six points each.

While its defense held the visitors scoreless, Lone Rock took a three-score lead in the first quarter on a point throw and Martin and Olson's free throw and with Marks collecting his five points and Pollard counting four, it ran its lead to 14-2 at halftime with an 11-point barrage in the second period.
