Crisler Debates Offer of Michigan Position

NEW YORK, N. Y.—New developments have revived the prospect that Herbert Crisler (Ft.) Crisler will leave Princeton to become head football coach at the University of Michigan it was reported today.

It was learned that Crisler, if he goes to Ann Arbor, not only will replace Harry G. Kippke as football coach, but will occupy a full professorship and ultimately succeed Athletic Director Fielding H. Yost.

Crisler sidestepped comment, but Prof. Burnham H. Dell, Princeton's athletic director, said: "Mr. Crisler is considering developments with respect to the offer from Michigan. It is my understanding he has had the matter under consideration for some time."

"We are not aware that he has made any decision nor have we any definite information at this time to make public."

"Mr. Crisler's contract with Princeton as head football coach has two years to run and that is a factor to be considered."

The status of Michigan's effort to get Crisler has undergone sharp change within the last 24 hours. It came unexpectedly and on top of recent assurances from Crisler that, in so far as original overtures were concerned, he had made up his mind to reject them.
