Short Wave Notes
Station IRF in Rome, newest addition to the Italian short wave broadcasting system, is running 270 a close race for honors in transatlantic reception. Located at 9.83 megacycles, it has been coming in consistently and with a clarity and strength that many times over-shadows its co-broadcaster on 9.64 megacycles.

IRF was originally used only for long distance telephone communication, consequently has great power and a most efficient antenna system. The result is short wave reception at its best on practically any night the listener cares to tune it in.

Programs broadcast for Swiss residents abroad are especially enjoyable right now. They may be heard on Saturdays immediately after the regular League of Nations broadcast. HBL on 9.4 megacycles and HBP on 7.8 megacycles carry the broadcasts.

One European station likely to be overlooked by the short wave listener is ORK at Brussels, Belgium. Broadcasting only in the afternoons—from 12:30 to 2—many listeners are not at home to hear the enjoyable programs of music and news which this Belgian station transmits for the benefit of residents in Belgian possessions throughout the world. It has a frequency of 10.33 megacycles and usually comes in well.

Most short wave fans have already heard the new Venezuelan station—YVSRJ—located at Caracas. Those who have not may find it almost every night at 6.25 megacycles. This station requests reports of reception and gives in return a handsome verification card. Address the Seward Co., Box 1908, Caracas, Venezuela, South America.
