Court Finds Excuse for Man's Slaying Mother-in-Law

ZAGREB, Yugoslavia -(U.P.)-'Jail will be heaven to me compared to life with my mother-inlaw," Radoye Radosavlievitch, 32, a peasant, told the court when he was sentenced to 10 years at hard labor for killing her with a hatchet. Three years ago Radoye arried, sold his own farm, and went to live on the farm of his mother-in- law. When his money was gone, his life was made miserable by the women, witnesses testified. The court granted that there were extenuating reasons.
