That's the major mistake the international brass hats of boxing made last week in their big conference at Prince Barberini palace, Rome.

This brand new world boxing conference adopted a code designed to govern harmoniously the prize fighting industry from Burma to Budapest.

The only guy at that conference who didn't act a bit swat-batty was—above all people—our own spluttering Gen. John J. Phelan, chairman of the New York commission.

General Phelan wanted no more run-arounds. He'd seen enough in the United States. And he wasn't joining hands with anybody because his palms still smarted from the rapping they got when he reached toward the Illinois commission last summer.

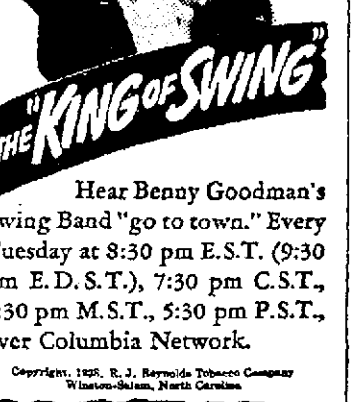
