Goslings Win to Hold Lead; Fort Upsets Jefferson

The Watertown Goslings retained their undisputed Central Wisconsin baseball league lead Sunday afternoon by scoring their sixth loop victory but they had their margin of leadership widened to a full game Monday afternoon when Fort Atkinson upset Jefferson, 9-4, for a tie for second place.

All of the Gosling runs were unearned as they bested Wally Higgins and the Waterloo McKays, 4-3, Ed Lehman was his own best friend Sunday afternoon as he led Jefferson at the plate and scattered six Genesee hits for a 3-1 victory but his efforts for a second win in as many days were thwarted as Fort won Monday at White-water. Wet grounds forced the postponement of the Fort Atkinson-Lake Mills game Sunday.

Higgins, 17-year-old ace, lost a heartbreaker as the Goslings won. He spaced the six Gosling hits well, but errors by his mates enabled the leaders to score. The McKays had seven hits off "Butch" Zoellick, Roy Zibell leading with four. Higgins had six strikeouts to Zoellick's seven but the latter issued six walks to Higgins' two.

Waterloo had a 2-1 lead at the end of the fifth. Harold Zibell's error on Cook's grounder after two were out and successive hits by Thielke and Block then gave the Goslings two runs and the lead and they marked up the winning run in the eighth when Duke Wagner tripled and scored on Werner Feutz's error. The McKays scored a run in the eighth on Adams' hit, walks to Feutz and Zimbrick, and Dean Higgins' life on an error, but Zoellick quelled the threat.

Jefferson was out-hit by Genesee, 6-5, but Lehman was invincible after the second inning in which the losers scored their run. Lehman retired seven losers via the strikeout route and collected two of his team's hits, driving in the winning run in the third and scoring one himself. Bill Brimmer had two of Genesee's hits.

Fort Atkinson was out-hit by Jefferson Monday but won the game on timely hitting in staging two big rallies in which it scored seven of its runs. It scored four runs in the fourth and three in the fifth. "Steamer" Raglitz pitched stellar ball for Fort when the Jeffs threatened dangerously. He allowed eight scattered hits while Lehman and Garstki were nicked for only seven. The box score:
