Four Madison Actors Take Part in Jackson's 'Post Road'

Four Madison actors will appear with the Al Jackson players in their production of "Post Road," opening at 8:30 tonight in the tent theater on E. Washington ave.

Doris McPherson, formerly with Jackson at the Garrick theater and lately with the Madison Civic theater, Elmer Borsuk, formerly with the University theater and Orson Welles' Mercury theater, and Van John Barton, formerly of the Goodman Art theater in Chicago, will be added to the cast.

The play was written by Wilbur Daniel Steele and Norma Mitchell, and later served as a starring vehicle for Charlotte Greenwood under the title of "Leaning on Letty." When Miss Greenwood presented it a year ago, Beverly Younger, Jackson's leading woman, was in the cast.

NBC Symphony Has Brilliant Debut

A significant development in American radio and an outstandingly brilliant achievement in the realm of music—both are recorded in a review of the NBC Symphony orchestra's first season, brought to a close by its 43rd Saturday night broadcast on June 25.

The world premieres of three American works were included: Dr. Howard Hanson's "Symphony Number 3 in D Major," the symphonic poem, "The Last Knight," by Hilda Ereny Davis, and Emerson, Withorne's "Sierra Morena," opus 59. Two works were given their American premieres: Shostakovich's "Fifth Symphony" and Aaron Copland's "El Salon Mexico."

Under the illustrious Arturo Toscanini and the nine guest conductors who shared the podium with him, this "first full-size, full-time symphony orchestra to be established by and for radio in the United States," during its first season, established several new precedents and shattered several old traditions.

Art School Session Will Open Monday

Courses in the Colt School of Art, summer school will start Monday, and will continue five weeks, to Aug. 13.

Emphasis this summer will be on out-of-doors drawing and painting. There will also be a group for portrait painting, which will meet on Monday, Wednesday and Friday afternoons, and a night class for adults in figure drawing from life on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Music Clinic Enrolls 600

With a total enrollment of more than 600 high school student musicians and directors of music from all parts of Wisconsin and the middle-west expected, the ninth annual music clinic of the University of Wisconsin will get under way today and Monday.

Sponsored annually by the school of music, the clinic gives music directors and student musicians of high schools an opportunity for three weeks of intensive music study under some of the country's foremost music teachers.

On the faculty Carleton Stewart, director of the Madison City, Ia., high school's national championship band; Henry Sopkin, director of the Chicago Lake View high school orchestra, many times winner of the national orchestra contest; Prof. W. H. Manning, of Utah Agricultural college, nationally known opera coach; Maybelle Glenn, Kansas City, Mo., director of music, recognized as one of the leaders in the field of grade and high school vocal music in America; David Nyvall, director of high school music in Chicago and outstanding chorus director; and Walter Heermann, solo cellist with the Cincinnati symphony orchestra, who will teach the clinic's cello section and a new class in solo repertoire.
