Budge Wins Match from Chinese Star

DUBLIN—(U.P.)—Donald Budge, world's No. 1 tennis player, Oakland, Calif., Tuesday scored a 6-0, 7-5 exhibition victory over Sin Kie Kuo, Chinese Davis cupper.

Riggs Sees Grant as Rival Davis Cup Team Player By ROBERT WEBB (United Press Staff Correspondent) CHESTNUT HILL, Mass.—Twenty-year-old Bobby Riggs, the confident Californian second only to Don Budge in America's tennis rankings, said Tuesday that he considers Betsy Grant his most serious rival for the No. 2 singles berth on the American Davis cup team.

Of course, there are six or eight players who have a chance to win the position, added Riggs, who is seeded second to Wilmer Allison in the current Longwood Bowl tournament at the historic Longwood Cricket club, "but I think Grant is the best player."

Riggs record against Frank Parker, Americas third ranking player and prominently mentioned for the No. 2 Davis cup singles berth, makes Parker the underdog in their future matches.

Beater Parker Five Times Riggs has defeated Parker five times in their eight matches since 1936 and hasn't lost to him in the last two years. Against Grant, Riggs has been less successful. In their only meeting on grass, Riggs beat Grant at Rye in 1936. They have met twice this year on clay and each won one decision.

"I am more serious about winning that Davis Cup singles position than anything I ever tackled," said Riggs. "Ever since I won the National Junior championship, I've hoped for a chance to play on the team. And if I can beat Grant, it looks as if I will make it. I spent the winter polishing all parts of my game."

Although he stands only five feet eight and weighs 138 pounds, Riggs is a mature tennis player. He took two sets from Von Cramm in the 1937 national singles and was ranked fourth nationally in 1936 at the age of 18.

His record in 1938 tournaments is uniformly good. He has won 12 out of 16 including the National Clay Courts championship for the third consecutive time. A tireless player, he thrives on work and constant competition improves his game.

Unlike many of his contemporaries, Riggs comes from a non-tennis-playing family. Neither his father nor mother ever played and his four brothers, all older, never excelled. Riggs played in his first tournament at 12 after only two months with his first racket. He won the cup and has been winning ever since.
