# Nazi Museum Shows Fame of Zeppelins

FRIEDRICHSHAVEN- (U.P.) The only Zeppelin museum in the world has been opened here, bringing a seven-year-old idea to fruition. This idea was carried out provisionally and incompletely previously by the bringing together of various exhibits related to the subject in the Administra-tion building of the airport.

The main entrance leads into a hall of honor which is dedicated to the inventor of the airship that bears his name, Count Zeppelin. Tall arched windows, rugged granite and polished marble give this ball the subdued, majestic air of a sanctuary. In it stands a heroic sized statue of a general of cavalry. On both sides are the coats of arms of the cities of Constance, the count's birthplace, and of Friedrichshaven, the scene of his greatest labors and triumph.

## County Lawyers Guild Asks Probe at Jersey City

The senate civil liberties committee led by Sen. La Follette today had before it a request by the executive board of the Dane county chapter of the National Law-yers guild "to make a complete and full investigation of the reported suppression of civil rights and liberties in Jersey City, N. J., and of the un-American attitude of

The request in form of a resoluion was made in response to a plea by the Hudson county guild of Jersey City, which is urging action by the La Follette commit-


