RICHLAND CENTER—The city schools and the county normal will start next week with 11 new teachers. Although the two high school additions built this summer will not be completed, Supt. George O'Brien has announced the school will open as scheduled on Tuesday. Another increase in enrollment is expected for the high school.

New faculty members in the junior and senior high schools are Dorothy Freitag, succeeding Valerie Koops, English; Barton Grives, succeeding Milo Willard, civics and general science; June Johnson, succeeding Evelyn Thomson, librarian; Fred Gehlhoff, succeeding Woodrow Nold, athletic director; Cleo Gehrke, English; and Leonard Ward, commerce.

Changes in the grade schools are Jane Johns succeeding Grace Shaker, West side second grade; Dorothy Kemp succeeding Mabel Ness, West side fifth grade; Eleanor Williams succeeding Eleanor Rockefeller, South side kindergarten; and the successor to Helen Barlow, Normal school fourth grade, who has not yet been named.

Esther Holt has been added to the county normal school faculty to teach music and part of the social sciences.

Fair, Moderate Weather Aided Crops, Report

Farm work made good progress in Wisconsin last week, F. H. Coleman, U. S. meteorologist at the Milwaukee weather bureau, said today in his weather and crop summary for the period ending Tuesday.

Temperatures averaged slightly above normal, although several nights were too cool; showers were light to moderate and most of the week was fair with adequate sunshine, the report says. Some fall plowing was done, also some sowing of winter wheat and rye. Much grain in the fields is now threshed. Because of previous wet weather much grain is in bad condition.

"Late potatoes and sugar beets are doing very well. Tobacco cutting is well along but there were some reports of hail and wind damage during the week. The cranberry crop is in only fair condition. Much excellent garden truck is now on the market."
