Lake Mills Eleven May Cop Third Straight Title By JOE DOMMERSHAUSEN If Rock Valley high school league coaches were to hold a meeting this week for the definite purpose of picking the probable 1938 league football champion, they would probably come to no other decision than that Lake Mills, titlist for the past two years, will repeat.

On paper, Lake Mills again is rated as tops in the conference this fall with Milton Union, annually its chief nemesis, and Brodhead likely to be its most dangerous threats for the title honors. Jefferson and Whitewater College High stack up as probably dark horse contenders and Evansville appears as the weakest of the lot, but not without the contention that it may surprise.

Rabe, a 200-pounder, have been showing top-notch ability as well as Mary Cowell, Harley Sahy, and Irving Hillison. Coach George O'Neil has only five lettermen on hand around which to build his Evansville eleven and speed will probably be the most valuable asset of the Blues again. Evansville has gained the reputation of being a scrapper no matter what the material shapes up to and the axiom may hold true again this fall. O'Neil has a couple of fine backs in Jim Bovre, fullback, and Jerry Half-bucks, and if he can uncover a speedy and shifty quarterback, the Blues may strike an unexpected jolt or two to their foes' title aspirations.

Coach Carl Hager of Jefferson is optimistic about his team's prospects. He too has only five lettermen around which to build his team and his biggest problem is to uncover capable successors to Les Praefert, husky tackle, and Bob Schneider, 210-pound center. Don Chawala, Dick Wagner, Bob Statz, and Cliff Smilie formed a fine backfield quartet in the team's 7-0 loss to the State School for the Dead team last week. Smilie is one of the best aerial tossers in the league, however, and undoubtedly the Jeffs will be playing a passing game as their best offensive.

Coach Fred Richmond, who was under Irl Tubbs when the Iowa mentor was at Superior, has designs of his team making a bid for the title. He has five lettermen, namely, Don Walsh, Jim Wilcox, Dan Mitchell, Merlin Hare, and Art Calkins as the nucleus for his eleven and has two excellent new prospects in Paul Hodge, 170-pound fullback who transferred from an Indiana school, and Dan Davis, 170-pound lineman, who is working at center. In all, 23 candidates are reporting. Mitchell is a four letterman while Walsh is the only back among the returning monogram winners. Candidates:

Graduation Hits Mills Lake Mills lost heavily through graduation, its biggest loss being a heavyweight line, and although a heavy forward wall will be missing this fall the Gold team will by no means be lightweight. All of the lettermen are heavier but the team as a whole will be somewhat lighter than last year's and Capicik will probably employ a new offensive.

Milton Union's success lies in how Coach Carl Anderson copes with the situation of rebuilding the backfield, as all of the first string backs and many of the first reserves were lost through graduation. But the outlook for a winning combination is a rosy one. Nine lettermen are back as well as 14 other experienced men. The Unionites placed, second in the league last year and should equal that record if not better it. The Union eleven will have a veteran line and Anderson, noted for getting the most out of his material, is shifting backfield candidates in building a fast and deceptive secondary. Wesley Stockman, Stoddard, halfback, and Steiner, a duo as a nucleus for a good backfield.
