'Brief Respite' Injury Claim Upheld

An employe injured when he momentarily steps out of the sphere of his work for a "brief respite" is eligible to receive compensation, Circuit Judge Alvin C. Reis ruled Saturday, reversing a recent industrial compensation decision.

Reis held that Arthur R. Guenther, 27, Kenosha, trucker for the Motor Transport Co., Milwaukee, should receive compensation for a leg broken in Waukegan, Ill., when he jumped back from the attack of a dog. He had stopped momentarily in his work to inspect a box.

Guenther's "brief respite" from his work, Reis contended, was a "natural and reasonable thing to do." The man, jumped backward, fell over a timber nearby and sustained the injury.

"We believe that the temporary recreation here involved—'brief respite'—legitimate in character and not unnatural to participate, does not suspend the employment nor stamp the accident as one not arising out of the employment," Reis said.

Police Clear Mystery of Abandoned Car

Disappearance of a couple who abandoned a car after it hit a parked car and a house in the 800 block on Williamson st., early Friday was cleared up by police Saturday night.

Robert Scharfenberg, 25, of 322 W. Main st., reported at the police station that the car was his and that he left the scene because Evelyn Mergen, 25, of 528 Clemens ave., who was riding with him, suffered bruises, and that he wanted to take her to a doctor.

The driver said he did not see the parked car until it was too late to stop, and after striking the car, his auto jumped the curb and hit the house.
