



Farr Is Test for Lou Nova Friday Night

(Copyright 1838 by United Press) NEW YORK-(U.R)-One of the most significant heavyweight lights in history will be staged at Madison Square Garden Friday night when young Lou Nova, the "Alameda Adonis", tries to knock out Tommy Farr, the tough Welshman who lasted the distance against Louis Braddock and Baer. If 23-year-old Nova can belt out, or beat impressively, rugged Tommy, the crowd will roar its acclaim for a new ring hero—for a new "white hope"—for a men

worth his weight in gold. Eyes of the boxing world will be focused on that patch of light in the darkened Garden Friday night. Over the wires and through the air will go crackling the chronicle of Nova's success or failure. All pugilism is waiting to learn if this handsome young Californian may be the man of destiny, the million-dollar mauler who ulti-mately may dethrone that great colored champion, Joe Louis.

Golden Opportunity

Never before has such a golden opportunity beckoned to any leather-tosser. No-not even in the days when Gene Tunney came along to battle the mighty Jack Dempsey before the largest gates ever known. Because there was no racial angle in the Dempsey-Tunney allairs. And earlier, when big Jess Willard took the title from Jack Johnson, the first colored heavyweight king, the million-dollar gate was just a dream. Now the setting is perfect, if Nova can blast Farr into the resin

dust. Mike Jacobs has the organization and the money to stage the "battle of the century" if he can find a young, tough, hard hitting white fighter to throw into the ring with Louis. Fans will shower down their shekels to witness such a "dream

fight". If Nova knocked out Farr would not be surprised to see Nova and Louis draw more than \$1,500,000 when they tangle for the title. If the bout is staged in Chicago's Soldier Field, the gate might even exceed \$2,000,000. Nova the Under Deg

But Nova hasn't beat Farr yet. In fact the fair-skinned, curlyheaded Californian is an 8-5 under-dog in the betting. Many of the "experts" figure that he lacks the experience to triumph over the troublesome tin miner from Tonypandy.

Desputey and Tunney believe Nova has been brought along too fast, and that Manager Ray Carlen over-matched him when Ray signed for the Farr bout.

Farr is not a great fighter, be-cause he can't punch. But the scar-faced man is tougher than a mule and has unlimited staming No one ever knocked him out, And this is only Nova's 27th



Who's Who Among Wisconsin Birds



The cooper's hawk, often called the hen hawk, together with the sharpshinned hawk and the goshawk, have done much to give the entire hawk family a bad reputation. As a general rule hawks are much more beneficial

than harmful and conservationists warn against indiscriminate killing of birds of this family as the tendency is to treat hawks alike. Like the sharpshinned hawk that it closely resem-

bles, the cooper's hawk eats birds and poultry, chip-munks, squirrels, mice, lizards, etc. It often catches birds on the wing and is a distinct poultry yard hazard. The cooper's hawk breeds from southern Canada to

northern Mexico. It winters in central and southern United States and is casual in winter farther north. breeds throughout the wooded portions of the state.

Its nest is of sticks and may be lined with finer twigs and bark shreds. The nest is apt to be found 15 to 50 feet up in a large tree, frequently in an oak or tamarack, usually in a crotch or near the The cooper's hawk flies
